LISTERS' CORNER

Since the publication of last year's *Listers' Comer*, I have received a number of notes from birders saying how much they enjoyed the newsletter. I want to thank everyone who wrote; your notes are very much appreciated. Perhaps the note I enjoyed the most was from Joan Czapalay of Barrington Passage, Nova Scotia. She wrote "This has been my first year listing and it has been so much fun. Some year I'm going to have 300 in N.S.; in the meantime I'm so grateful for the help of many friends." Her note takes me back more years than I care to count to my early years as a birder and lister. I discovered then and still maintain that, while the biggest thrill in birding is to see a new bird, the next biggest thrill is to help another keen birder see a new bird. Joan must have had many thrills and much help from Nova Scotia birders in the past year of listing, as she is not far from breaking her 300 goal.

I received two letters concerning the question of which jurisdiction birds are in when they are seen over the waters of Hudson and James bays. Both were from Manitoba, and both were convinced that such birds should be counted for the Northwest Territories. I have taken the coward's way out. For the local list category, I have labelled the Hudson/James Bay locations according to the provincial practice for that area.

Birds and Computers

As computers more and more invade our daily lives, they are also invading our birding hobby. As I understand it, Gerry Bennett put out 54 issues of *Birdfinding in Canada* through the 1980s using a typewriter. I could not dream of bringing out an issue of *Listers' Corner* without a database program and a word processor. Nowadays, it seems I am seeing new computerized applications for birding aids in virtually every new issue of *Birding*. One application that particularly interests me is a device that picks up very high frequency notes and replays them at a lower frequency. The devices are individually adjusted according to your hearing loss and help birders who are losing some of their upper register to continue to hear species such as Blackpoll Warbler.

There has been a proliferation of computer programs for keeping bird lists, and some of these programs now will record all of a birder's field notes and then work out the various lists. Over the past several years I have been building my own program so I can ensure it will do everything I want, but I sometimes wonder if I should have just purchased a canned program. As birders more frequently computerize their records, the opportunity will exist to collect these records for provincial databases that will then permit better analyses of what is happening to bird populations. I am aware of one province (Quebec) that has already set up such a process, and two provinces (New Brunswick and Alberta) that are in the process of doing so; there may be others. Some of you may have seen my letter in the April 1995 issue of Birding, in which I propose the adoption of a standard format for bird observations so that bird records can easily be exchanged between the various listing/birding programs and between birders and the places that may want to collect and analyse the records.

The Internet is another computer application that has great potential for birding. Imagine coming home from a birding trip, entering your field notes, having the program update all your lists, and then instantly sending your notes over the Internet to the regional compiler of American Birds who could easily process your records with his program. The Internet now has rare bird alerts from a number of locations that can be read by Internet users across North America. (If you are on the Internet and would like to know more about this, send me a note at tull@acs.ucalgary.ca) Last year I included my Internet address in Listers' Comer and received four replies. Who knows, someday the forms to fill out for Listers' Comer may be distributed via the Internet, your lists electronically submitted and read into the database, and the newsletter then distributed over the Internet. In this way, you could electronically find your name through the text and then print off your own personalized Listers' Corner with your name highlighted each time it occurs.

But enough of future trends. Read on to see the present trends in Canadian listing.

Throughout this report, I have used the same figures for the total numbers of species seen in the various regions as those that I used last year. To make any of the lists, a birder needed a life list of 40% of the provincial/territorial total in Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland or the two territories, and 50% of the provincial total in the other provinces. Thresholds in the other areas were 350 for Canada, 500 for the ABA area, and 1000 for the ATPAT and world life lists. Life lists are for the period up to the end of 1994, with the exception of those marked with an asterisk, which were reported as of the end of 1993. Figures in brackets are the increases reported in lists over the figures from last year.

A total of 114 birders made the threshold in one or more provinces or territories, and 83 made the threshold in Canada, the ABA area, the world or the ATPAT list. Ontario once again was the province with the most birders (64) making the threshold, followed by British Columbia (32), and then Manitoba and New Brunswick at 24. New Brunswick showed the largest increase (14) over last year in the number of birders who made the threshold. Of the larger areas, the one with the most birders making the threshold was Canada (79), followed by the ABA area (55).

Alan Wormington's Ontario list of 408 remains the top provincial list, but he has been joined in breaking the 400 threshold by Norm Chesterfield (401) in Ontario and by Jo Ann MacKenzie (401) and David Stirling (400) in British Columbia. Other birders are close to 400 in both B.C. and Ontario, but the top list in any other province (Mabel McIntosh with 355 in Quebec) is considerably lower. There is no change in the birders who have broken the 300 threshold in two or more provinces (Christopher Escott in SK and ON; Roger Foxall in BC, ON and NS; Alex Gray, Hue and Jo Ann MacKenzie in BC and ON; Richard Klauke and Suzanne Benoit in BC and AB; Harv Lane in SK and MB; Mabel McIntosh in ON and QC; and the author in BC, AB and ON). Harv is the only one to do so without benefit of the higher possible lists in Ontario and B.C. Christopher Escott has joined Harv Lane and Jo Ann MacKenzie in having two lists over the 75% mark. The top provincial percentage reported is 92% by Rudolf Koes in Manitoba — the only province with birders (3) over the 90% mark.

Eleven birders have made the cutoff threshold in five or more provinces/territories (Brooke Clibbon, Angus MacLean, Jo Ann MacKenzie and David Stirling in 5; Hue MacKenzie and Larry Neily in 6; Alex Gray in 9; Roger Foxall and Blake Maybank in 10; and Wayne Neily and the author in 12). Roger increased his number of provinces by 2 over last year, while Wayne increased his by 1. Hue MacKenzie noted that he has three lists (BC, ON, QC) that total 1000 when added together. This is not a first, however, as Jo Ann MacKenzie has three lists totalling 1005. Hue may have to settle for being the only birder to have a three-province sum of 1000 with no list breaking 400. The biggest provincial increases over last year were 28 species by Roger Foxall in Saskatchewan and 25 by John Luce in British Columbia. The number of species John added in one year is particularly noteworthy because of his starting point; he went from 76% to 82% of the B.C. list.

Norm Chesterfield remains safely ensconced on top of the Canada list with 517, up 2 from last year. His lead of 20 seems insurmountable for some time to come, although Hue and Jo Ann MacKenzie trimmed Norm's lead by one last year. Both MacKenzies are poised to break 500 for Canada this year if they can do as well as they did last year. Mike Austin, the lone Texan-Canadian reporter, showed the biggest increase (23) in his Canada list. Norm Chesterfield also has a commanding lead of 952 in his world list (6617). It will take runner-up Martin Edwards more than seven years to catch Norm's current list if Martin continues to add species at the rate he did last year. The biggest increases last year in world lists were 608 by John Keenleyside and 303 by Margaret Bain. Mike Austin at 772 remains well ahead of the rest for the ABA area (North America north of Mexico, excluding Greenland). The top increases in ABA area lists last year were Joan McDonald (46) and Drew Campbell (37), but the biggest achievement was probably Tony Mason breaking the 700 threshold. The biggest increases in ATPAT lists (All Territories and Provinces Added Together) were 361 by Richard Klauke, 154 by Theo Hofman and 138 by Suzanne Benoit. After many years in second place in the ATPAT lists, Wayne Neily has been passed by Blake Maybank, and I am feeling decidedly uncomfortable atop the heap.

Year lists given here are a birder's best ever year list as well as the birder's 1994 year list. If the 1994 list was the best ever, that is the only list shown. The cutoff thresholds were 30% of the provincial/territorial list for Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland and the two territories; 40% for the other provinces; and 80% of the life list cutoff for Canada, ATPAT, ABA area and the world. Sixty birders made the cutoffs for one or more year lists. Ontario (38), Canada (34) and British Columbia (24) were the most popularly reported areas.

Ontario leads the provinces with nine birders who have broken 300 during one year. British Columbia is next with seven, but the top six year lists there are greater than or tied with the top Ontario list (Alan Wormington at 320). John Luce has the top provincial year list with 331 in B.C. The only list of 300 or more in any of the other provinces is Richard Klauke with 300 in Alberta. On a percentage basis, the top year lists are all from the prairie provinces -- Robert Parsons (80% in MB); Richard Klauke and Suzanne Benoit (78% in AB); Rudolf Koes (78% in MB); Gordon Grieef (77% in MB); Harv Lane (76% in MB); and Burke Korol (75% in SK).

Gerry Bennett leads the Canada year lists with 401, but he is no longer the only one reporting a Canada year list of 400 or more. Suzanne Benoit now has a Canadian year list of 400, a result of recounting following the latest AOU taxonomic changes. Richard Klauke (539) and Mike Austin (538) are neck-and-neck for the top ABA area year list. Norm Chesterfield at 1710 is way ahead with his world year list.

Forty-two year lists were reported for 1994. John Luce's top provincial year list of 331 in British Columbia was achieved in 1994, and this no doubt accounted for the big increase in his B.C. life list. Other noteworthy and/or top 1994 year lists were Danny Tyson (298 in BC); Andrew Slater (253 in AB); Burke Korol (245 in SK); Robert Parsons (291 in MB) closely followed by Rudolf Koes (289); Don Perks (285 in ON) closely followed by Jerry Guild (284); Blake Maybank (253 in NS) closely followed by Joan Czapalay (249); Blake (128 in PE); and Doug Phelan (140 in NF). The top 1994 year list for Canada was Eric MacBean with 348, and the top ABA area list was Suzanne Benoit with 449 closely followed by Mike Austin with 447.

DAY LISTS

As with year lists, a birder's best ever day list and the birder's best day list for 1994 are both reported. To be published, day lists had to make the thresholds of 20% for Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland and the two territories, and 30% for the other provinces. Fifty-six day lists are reported here from 32 birders.

Manitoba continues to boast the top day lists with 205 (Rudolf Koes) and 204 (Gordon Grieef). The Manitoba combination of northern boreal forest, southern hardwoods in the Red River Valley, prairie grasslands, and fantastic wetland areas, when combined with indefatigable birders who have worked out the routes and logistics in great detail, make this region very difficult to match. Manitoba has six day lists that exceed the next highest provincial percentage for a day list (Harv Lane with 45% in Saskatchewan). The highest day lists outside Manitoba are from Ontario (Alan Wormington with 186) and British Columbia (Richard Cannings with 177).

The top day lists during 1994 were again from Manitoba, and were again the same two birders, Rudolf Koes (198) and Gordon Grieef (196). Rudolf in fact recorded day lists of 198 on two consecutive weekends in 1994! Other noteworthy big days in 1994 were Richard Cannings (163 in BC), Margaret Bain (181 in ON), and Blake Maybank (140 in NS and 128 in PE). Blake's record in Prince Edward Island is noteworthy not only because it is the top percentage reported in 1994 outside of Manitoba, but also because that one-day total gave Blake the top P.E.I. year list.

WINTER LISTS

.

Winter lists cover the period of December, January and February. Winter life lists -- the birds seen during those months in any year -- are reported as of the end of 1994, with the exception of those marked with an asterisk, which are reported as of the end of 1993. The single winter lists are the lists of species seen during one winter. Listed are a birder's best ever single winter list and the birder's list for the winter of 1993/94. The thresholds for winter life lists were 25% for Canada, British Columbia, and Ontario; 15% for Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland and the two territories; and 20% for the other provinces. Thresholds for single winter lists were 5% less. Thirty-nine birders submitted winter lists that are over these thresholds. The most popularly-reported provinces are Ontario (32 life or single winter lists) and British Columbia (26). I suspect that, with the exception of a few hardy souls, birders in other provinces or territories (including the author) sensibly prefer to hibernate during the winter months.

The top winter life lists, both in terms of numbers and percentages, are Alan Wormington (254) and Don Perks (249) in Ontario, followed by Wayne Weber (235) in British Columbia. They are the only birders to have broken 50% of the provincial lists. Richard Klauke, with 113 in Alberta, has the top winter life list for the prairie provinces, closely followed by Rudolf Koes with 112 in Manitoba. The top winter life lists east of Ontario are Blake Maybank with 178 in Nova Scotia and Mabel McIntosh with 177 in Quebec. The top winter life list for Canada (Jo Ann MacKenzie with 270) is only 16 more than Alan Wormington's total for Ontario.

The top single winter list is that of Wayne Weber (170) in British Columbia, closely followed by Hue and Jo Ann MacKenzie at 168 and 167. Next are Ontario and Nova Scotia, which are neck-and-neck in terms of percentage (32%), with David Milsom topping Ontario at 148 and Blake Maybank topping Nova Scotia at 139. Ross Dickson has the top single winter list on the prairies with 77 in Alberta. For the 1993/94 winter (the last one recorded for this newsletter), noteworthy single winter lists are those of Hue MacKenzie (168), Jo Ann MacKenzie (167) and John Luce (150) in British Columbia; David Milsom (133), Don Perks (132) and Hugh Currie (126) in Ontario; and Murray Newell (101) in Nova Scotia.

INTERPROVINCIAL LISTS

Interprovincial lists are those covering all or large parts of two or more provinces or territories. The lists included here are merged lists of the species seen in the area, rather than lists formed by adding provincial lists together.

Atlantic Canada has the top interprovincial list (Blake Maybank with 361). The prairie provinces are close runners-up (Rudolf Koes with 358). There would appear to be seven prairie province lists that exceed the second-highest Atlantic Canada list, but Roger Foxall, David Christie and Mary and Mike Majka all have lists from one Atlantic province that would put them into this picture. Wayne Neily has the top list for northern Canada at 194. The top interprovincial year lists are from the prairie provinces (Richard Klauke with 316 and Rudolf Koes with 309).

Two lists that strike me as notable are those of Richard Cannings with 105 species in Canada north of the Arctic Circle, and Wayne Weber with 109 species in Canada seen at altitudes above 1500 metres. These are two parts of Canada where it must be very difficult to build up a list.

For all but a few northern areas, the thresholds for local lists have been set at 150 for life lists and 120 for year lists. Local life lists are reported as of the end of 1994, with the exception of those marked with an asterisk, which are reported as of the end of 1993. This year I have given up trying to divide local lists into categories. I have often got them wrong in the past, and some of the new areas this year are completely unfamiliar to me. Instead I have listed all the local lists on a province by province basis.

Local lists remain very popular. This year 88 birders met the threshold for 108 local areas, which is up by 17 over the number of local areas last year. I may have been mistaken in stating earlier that birders in much of Canada sensibly hibernate during the winter. The evidence would suggest they spend the winters around the fireplace with their old bird notes, working out ever more lists for increasingly more obscure local areas.

The top local list is that of Don Perks (348) for Toronto. Don has a healthy lead in Toronto, where 10 birders have broken the 300 mark. The next highest local lists are Alan Wormington (336) for Point Pelee and Allen Woodliffe (332) for Kent/Essex/Lambton counties in Ontario. Twenty-eight birders have broken the 300 mark for a local life list. Seven (led by Wayne Weber with 320 in Vancouver) are for three areas on the B.C. coast; 17 are for 7 areas in Ontario; three (led by Mabel McIntosh with 325) are for Montreal; and one (Blake Maybank with 305) is for Halifax/Dartmouth. Allen Woodliffe has joined Alan Wormington and David Stirling in having two local lists over 300. There are no local lists over 300 for the prairie provinces, but Andrew Slater with 295 for Calgary is not far away.

Some notable northern lists that could get lost in all the more southerly lists are Rudolf Koes with 162 for Churchill; Alan Wormington with 306 for Northern Ontario and 229 for Moosonee; Tom Murray with 266 for Grey/Bruce counties in Ontario; Claudette Cormier and Germain Savard with 282 and 281 respectively for the Saguenay/Lac St. Jean region of Quebec; and Gerard Benoit and Hilaire Chiasson with 269 and 268 respectively for the Acadian Peninsula of New Brunswick. Among the high lists for small areas are those of Rudolf Koes (235 for each of Delta Marsh and Oak Hammock in Manitoba), Alex Gray (242 for Rattray Marsh in Mississauga), David Christie and Mary Majka (252 and 244 respectively for Mary's Point, New Brunswick), Richard Stern (239 for Brier Island, Nova Scotia), and Murray Newell and Wilfred Atwood Jr. (238 and 235 respectively for Cape Sable Island, Nova Scotia). Note that contrary to popular opinion, Mary's Point, New Brunswick was not named after Mary Majka.

The top local year list is 270 by Alan Wormington for Point Pelee National Park. Other top local year lists are those of Joel Ellis (252) for Kingston, Ontario; John Luce (244), Danny Tyson (239), Wayne Weber (236), Eric MacBean (233) and Jo Ann MacKenzie (233) for Vancouver; Larry Neily (240) and Daniel St-Hilaire (220) for Hull/Ottawa; Claudette Cormier (239) and Germain Savard (236) for Saguenay/Lac St. Jean; Murray Newell (226) for Shelburne County, Nova Scotia; and William Lindley (225) for London, Ontario. Some other notable local year lists are those of Benoit Hebert (200) for the Acadian Peninsula, Alex Gray (183) for Rattray Marsh, and Blake Maybank (140) for Gros Morne National Park and (121) for Churchill.

OTHER LISTS

Trust Gerry Bennett to submit the most unusual list. He reports that he has birded with two birders named "Lister", Lister Sinclair from Toronto and Robert Lister from Edmonton. Can anyone match him? (No fair naming your children Lister just to get into the competition.) Gerry also reports that he has seen 93 species in Ontario during each month of the year, with another 14 species recorded in 11 months. Alex Gray visited the Rankin Inlet area of the Northwest Territories last year and found 34 species in 10 days, including a nesting Wheatear. As he has previously visited Pond Inlet, he is obviously moving to grab the lead when Nunavut becomes official. I have seen 48 species in every province and territory -- a number that will plummet sharply when Nunavut becomes a new territory.

Overall this year, 1196 lists have passed the thresholds. These lists are from 123 birders -- an average of 9.7 lists per birder. Seventeen listers had more than twice the average number of lists that passed their respective thresholds (Burke Korol 20; Gordon Grieef and Angus MacLean 21; Gerry Bennett, Hugh Currie and Larry Neily 22; Richard Klauke and Hue MacKenzie 25; David Stirling 26; Rudolf Koes 28; Wayne Weber 29; Jo Ann MacKenzie 30; Robert Parsons 31; Alex Gray 38; Wayne Neily 43; the author 47 [I miscounted myself last year]; and Blake Maybank 72. Alex Gray showed the biggest increase over last year when he had 13; he has confessed to digging back through all his notes last year to work out more lists. Richard Klauke wrote that he "still has not managed to get the time to calculate the numbers for about 10 or more lists -- maybe next year". Blake Maybank indicated that his goal is to break the threshold for all Nova Scotia counties. I suspect that secretly he plans to pass the threshold for every local birding area in Canada. So look for more local lists next year.

I have always intended to write something on "The Joy of ATPAT". I have been keeping an ATPAT list since some time in the 1970s, when I was in a competition with Wayne Neily to see who could first attain 50% of the then provincial totals accepted by ABA. Since there were only two of us competing, there were only two versions of who won, but the ATPAT list gave us something further to compare when we had each achieved the thresholds of that time. Gerry Bennett coined the phrase ATPAT and formalized the competition in *Birdfinding in Canada*. The biggest thrill with ATPAT is visiting a new province and seeing your list climb with every bird you see. It is possible to get a high ATPAT list without having to have one of the top lists in one or more provinces. But I think the most important attribute of the ATPAT list, at least to me is that encourages birders to bird in as much of Canada as possible. This is a great country to get to know from coast to coast to coast, and a great country to bird! My goal is to reach 3000 for my ATPAT list, but it is not going to be easy. I should pass 2800 in 1995, but the last 100 species have taken me since 1986. I am not travelling as much as I formerly did and future species will be that much tougher to add. Nunavut will not help me very much. I suspect that Blake Maybank, or possibly Roger Foxall, will be the first to break 3000.

This is the last Listers' Corner that I will be producing. I have been writing a column for Canadian Birding or the present product since 1990, and I am running out of things to say. I have enjoyed bringing out Listers' Corner, working with the lists, and getting to know Canadian birders both by name and by lists even when I have never met you. Burke Korol has agreed to take over the publication, and I will be passing to him the mailing list and the records. Burke's address is 314 Haight Cres., Saskatoon SK, S7H 4V9. You should be hearing from him in the fall. I hope birders will continue to support Burke, as you have supported Gerry, Blake and myself.
