

LISTERS' CORNER C. Eric Tull

This issue features provincial lists. 363 lists have made the cutoff thresholds (40% in Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland, Yukon and Northwest Territories; 50% in the other provinces). This is an increase of 24 from a year ago. The provinces with the greatest numbers meeting the thresholds were Ontario with 127, British Columbia with 54, and Manitoba with 35.

In spite of the increased number of lists being reported and making the thresholds, there are a number of lists that are getting quite out-of-date. Lists marked (-) are those that have not been updated since the previous provincial list issue of a year ago, whereas those marked (=) have not been updated since November 1990. To keep lists more or less up-to-date, I propose to drop from next year's provincial issue any lists currently marked (=) that are not updated in the interim. So please send me your updates, even if they have not changed.

I have also marked lists that have just breached the thresholds with a (+). These lists are either from birders who have not reported before, or from birders who have increased their lists sufficient to break the thresholds. Either way I am pleased to welcome them. Notable new reporters who rank among the tops in their provinces are Ross Dickson, Suzanne Benoit, and George Cheeseman in Alberta; Muriel Carlson in Saskatchewan; Tom Hayman in Ontario; Francois Blouin in Quebec; Richard Stern in Nova Scotia; and Doug Phelan in Newfoundland.

The 363 lists were reported by 203 birders. 133 birders met the threshold in 1 province, 38 met the thresholds in 2 provinces, 13 in 3 provinces, 6 in 4 provinces, 5 in 5 provinces, 2 in 6 provinces, 3 in 7 provinces, 1 in 9 provinces, and 2 in all 12 provinces and territories.

The leadership changed in two provinces. Richard Klauke has picked up 15 species since his last report to lead Alberta, and James Taylor now has the lead in Nova Scotia. In Saskatchewan, Stan Shaddick has joined the elite group of Bob Kreba, Rudolf Koes and Gordon Grieef who have broken 90% in a province. In New Brunswick, David Christie has dropped out of this group, as the provincial total used here has increased faster than his list. Knowing David I am sure he will soon be back at 90%.

Of the 363 lists reported, 105 (29%) have broken

the 75% barrier. Six birders have broken 75% in two provinces (Angus MacLean in NB and MB, Blake Maybank in NS and NF, Bruce Mactavish in NF and NS, Harv Lane in SK and MB, and Hue and Jo Ann Mackenzie in BC and ON), and Peter Hamel has broken 75% in three provinces (ON, MB, and BC). Of these, Harv Lane is the only one to have broken 80% in two provinces.

The other barrier, 300 species in a province, was broken by 156 lists or 43% of those making the thresholds. Eight birders have broken 300 for two provinces (Harv Lane, Hue and Jo Ann Mackenzie again; Alex Gray in ON and BC; Chris Escott in ON and SK; Mabel McIntosh in PQ and ON; Peter Hamel in BC and ON; and Richard Klauke in AB and BC), and two have broken 300 in three provinces (Roger Foxall in BC, ON, and NS; and the author in BC, ON, and AB).

It is comparatively easy to look at the trends among the leaders for the various provinces. For the most part the notable changes in rankings are the result of new reporters to Canadian Birding, updatings of lists after a gap of a few years, or birders dropping off lists. Changes in numbers for the leaders are generally comparatively small. It is more difficult to see who is making large strides among those in the middle and lower parts of the lists, where large increases in numbers are more likely.

To determine this I have compared this year's lists with those of last year, excluding those lists where the update covers several years of birding. Birders who have increased a provincial list by 15 or more in the past year are Ray Cooke with 38 in PE, Brooke Clibbon with 31 in AB, Burke Korol with 25 in SK, Bev Sarty with 20 in NS, Drew Campbell with 18 in ON, and Gordon Tufts with 17 in BC.

How many of you keep your lists or bird notes on a computer? I have been developing my own program for some time now, but it still doesn't do everything I want it to do. The Newburyport Birders' Exchange (8 Columbia Way, Plum Island, MA 01951) is preparing a directory of birding computer users. If you would like to be included send them information on the computer you use, your main software programs, the bird programs you use, description of any personal programs you have developed, and any specific interests within the field of birding (e.g., censuses, banding).

Since the publication in 1986 of Godfrey's 2nd Edition of *The Birds of Canada*, there has been no systematic, reasoned, and authoritative method of determining which new bird species deserve to be placed on the Canadian checklist. In short, there is no longer any "official" list. The AOU and the ABA provide such a recognized function for North American species, but Canada is now left out in the cold, so to speak.

We consulted with Earl Godfrey, and numerous other reliable birders and ornithologists nationwide, to come up with a plan to rectify this situation. Our solution: *Canadian Birding*'s Canada Checklist Committee.

For such a committee to succeed, it must be reputable and fair. To be reputable, we had to attract some of the most experienced birders in Canada, and to be fair, we had to have them work with an approved set of rules.

We have chosen the committee members, and are still working out the rules. In choosing participants, we attempted to ensure all regions of the country were represented, and we wanted committee members of high calibre. We believe we have succeeded on both counts. The committee members are:

- Roger Foxall, Atlantic Canada, an enthusiastic, cautious birder, who has lived and travelled widely across the country;
- Michel Gosselin, Quebec, who works with the National Museum

of Natural Science, is one of the Quebec regional editors for American Birds, and who co-authored les Noms Français des Oiseaux D'Amerique du Nord;

- Ross James, Ontario, with the Ontario Museum of Natural History, and author of *The Annotated Checklist of the Birds of Ontario*;
- Rudolf Koes, the Prairies, one of the most knowledgeable birders in the west, and one of the Prairie Region regional editors for *American Birds*; and
- Richard Cannings, B.C., experienced omithologist and birder, and co-author of *The Birds of the Okanagan*.

Earl Godfrey, the dean of Canadian birds, has agreed to advise the committee when required, and Jim Taylor, of Halifax NS, will be the Committee Co-ordinator.

The criteria for accepting new species has yet to be finalised, but sight records <u>will</u> be eligible for acceptance if photographs and/or specimens are not available.

And although Canadian Birding is not continuing much longer, this Committee will survive, as the American Birding Association has agreed to sponsor it if a Canadian sponsor cannot be found. The results will be published both by the A.B.A., and, we hope, by a magazine based in Canada.
