

2024 Edition (lists to Dec. 31, 2023)

The 2024 edition of *Canadian Listers' Corner* (CLC) is ready for viewing. As usual it is delivered as a PDF format file. As before, you will be able to print your own copy, as some may; or just view it on screen, as most will. Yet another difficult year for your compiler. My brother Wayne died in March. Many of you may have known or even birded with him. It has been a full-time job clearing out the old homestead. I have been exhausted and had little energy for this project. Perhaps next year will be better.

This issue includes 123 (-2 from last year) listers, 75 (-3) current and 48 (+1) carried forward from previous years. Thank you all for participating, and again I thank you for your patience. I also want to assure those of you who were generous enough to express your appreciation monetarily that, though what I do is done out of love, I am extremely grateful for your support. It really does help, especially these days.

The 123 listers include 8 who did not send updates for last year, 9 for the last two years, 11 for the last three, 6 for the last 4, 6 for the last five, and 6 even less current. We also have 3 recently deceased CLCers, Terry Osborne (died in 2021 – see *In Memoriam* pages at the end of this issue), Wayne Weber (died 2022 – see *In Memoriam* page at the end of the 2023 issue) and Mike Mulligan (died 2023 – see *In Memoriam* pages at the end of this issue), who are also still listed. My brother Wayne Neily was still alive at the end of 2023, so won't count as deceased until next issue (but see *In Memoriam* pages at the end of this issue). Against the losses we had only one new lister this year. Please welcome Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop from Cole Harbour, NS. We also had 3 previous CLC listers update their numbers this year: Martin Bowman and Gillian Horgan, Williamstown ON last reporting in 2021; and John Zoch, Harrow, ON (2019). Welcome back.

The eight 2022 listers who did not make submissions in 2023 were Steve Charlton, Rick Lauzon, Peter Mitchell, Liam Ragan, Ken Thorpe, Ray Woods and Brent & Carolynn Schmor. Each year I wonder why folks have not responded. I do sometimes get brief notes from some of you, which I always appreciate. However, I often do not hear when people move, change email addresses, have health issues or some other life-changing event which prevents them from submitting lists or influences them not to do so; or if they have simply moved on to other things. So, if you know of CLCers who have lost touch, please let me know the details.

A few of our non-responders are still readers, but they haven't caught up with their data entry. Some have little to report and don't. If you are from the latter group, please help me by sending an email saying your lists are unchanged. Because, if you have not updated your lists for five years, they are likely to disappear soon after (*see the removal policy on page 37*). Some listers update every couple of years or so. And we always have hope that former listers will send new numbers. You are always welcome to rejoin. For more statistical details see the Yearly Statistical Summary on page 96.

The CLC will never be redundant, even with eBird and various online listing services because there are still many lists not covered by these groups, especially the local (in space and time) and more arcane Canadian lists. And because it is meant to provide a yearly snapshot rather

than a constantly changing and updating view. And it is strictly for Canadian listers, hopefully fostering "polite" competition and helping like-minded souls keep in touch over the thousands of kilometres that are Canada.

As always, I value any suggestions for improvement to either the publication or the website. It is important to note here that any shortcomings related to this issue or the website are totally my responsibility. So please, if you see errors or omissions, let me know, and I will try to correct them. Thanks to everyone who helped to spread the word about CLC! Please continue to tell any of your listing friends about it and show them the publication and website. Word-of-mouth is still probably the best way to interest new listers to take part. Share the joy!

This category includes only the major Canadian Lifelist areas and some major areas that include Canada; i.e. Canada, the provinces and territories, ABA area, North America, the world and related lists. Year Lists, Day Lists, Photo/Audio Lists, Winter Lifelists and Single Winter Lists are reviewed under those category titles later in the issue. Other lists are treated as Local Lists and follow the previously mentioned categories. Some birders keep and submit only their lifelists. The interest and competition are usually strongest in these categories. While it is self-evident to serious birders just what a lifelist is, a novice reading this may not know. A lifelist is, logically enough, the number of species seen in a given area during one's entire life (to date). There are, of course, complications. The bird must be a full species and recognized by the listing jurisdiction(s) as a countable species. We hope by this to have comparable lists, though individual interpretation of rules can skew the numbers a bit. *Canadian Listers' Corner* does not vet lists; we simply hope and assume they are submitted according to the rules by competent observers.

Since the ABA has gone to online listing with no thresholds, and doesn't supply totals for areas, I have done my best to get accurate checklist totals for setting our thresholds. The sources are given in the *Thresholds* page on the CLC website. If anyone has more up-to-date numbers for any lists or knows where I can get them, please let me know. Clements 2023 edition and its supplements are the authority used for world species and families, though I understand that there are other systems that are challenging its position. The number of families rises by 2 to 250. Family Hyliidae is split from Family Macrosphenidae and Parrotbills Paradoxornithidae is added as a new family.

To be published, a birder needs a lifelist of 50% of the provincial/territorial total in most jurisdictions; but only 40% in PEI, NL, YT, and NT; and only 30% for Nunavut. These reduced thresholds are because of the dearth of lists from, and difficulties involved in birding in, some of our less populous and far-flung areas. If and when we get sufficient lists from these areas, the thresholds may rise. Other thresholds are as marked. Thresholds are shown after an area's total list in the table headers. Lifelists are as reported up to the end of 2023. Asterisks (*) indicates that the list may not be current, as no report was received from that person for the number of years equal to the number of asterisks (up to five), and their last report has been recycled. Numbers older than five years (*subject to deletion – see policy on page 37*) are shown by a single asterisk with a superscript number showing the years since reporting. Figures in brackets following a birder's name are increases reported since last year, or their last report. You may notice some lists that are short of the threshold, yet rounded off, are at the cutoff percentage. Given that the thresholds are a fairly quickly moving target, these are included. The symbol (†) indicates a lister who was deceased before the end of 2023. Thank you to those who have kept me informed of deaths, and as I always request, please let me know if you hear of any.

The sharper eyed among you may notice that some lists are less than they were on previous year(s). Unless it is an obvious error, I have to assume the lister has discovered, either through checklist changes or outright error, that the old total he had submitted was incorrect. I have adopted the policy of not showing amounts of decreases to avoid the inevitable "Why is that?" questions, to spare any potential embarrassment, and to allow for the possibility, quite likely in retroactive error cases, that there actually was no change from the previous year.

Some Lifelist Numbers

This year we have 785 (+7 from last year) threshold-meeting lifelists from 120 (+1) birders. Nearly 46%, or 364 (+1) of these are the 14 basic Canadian, provincial or territorial lists. The number of birders reaching the Canadian and ABA thresholds is now 101 (+1) and 75 (E) respectively. The North American category now has 40 (E), world listers 62 (+2) and world families 34 (+1). ATPAT lists stay at 42, while Total Ticks (one of the ultimate depravities) stayed at 19 listers. The provinces and territories (and their number of CLC listers), in high to low order, are ON (59), BC (41), AB (27), MB (25), SK (23), QC (20), NS (20), NB (15), YT (9), PE (8), NT (8), NL (5), and NU (3). NS catching up to Quebec was the only change in order.

Because the species totals are so wildly different from source to source, I'm simply leaving them as is until I find a believable authority. I'll keep all the thresholds from last year for 2024.

Canada 696 spp. (threshold = 350 spp.)

The year's top gainer was Mark Dennis, who added 19, to reach 451. Next best were Rick Brown with +16. Rob Dobos and Hugh Currie joined the 500 Club in 2023. One birder; Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop, Cole Harbour, NS (at 353) joined the Canada list for 2023. Roger Foxall continues to lead with an astounding 562; while Thomas Plath continues in 2nd at 538; Chris Escott has 535 for 3rd; and Bob Curry 532 for 4th. 2023 saw 16 (+2) listers with 500 or more, 57 (+2) with at least 450, and 89 (E) at 400. Of the 101 on this list there were 42 who reported gains in 2023 and one new member, meaning at least 43 of 100 were active.

British Columbia 558 spp. (threshold = 279 spp.)

Mike Toochin still leads here with 490. Sharon Toochin remained solidly in second spot at 465, while Roger Foxall moves into 3rd spot at 459 and Thomas Plath now 4th at 456. There were no new BC listers this year. We now have 20 CLC listers having more than 400 species in BC. Dominic Cormier had the highest gain (+9), while Eric Tull had +8 and Roger Foxall +7. This year we have 41 (E) listers for BC, well over half of which are residents (26). This year saw the top 19 spots all taken by residents.



This will serve not only to aid in finding last year's lists more easily, but also to give, at a glance, an idea of an area's current level of activity.

2023 saw nine (+4) listers qualify on the Canada Year List category. Top reported 2023 Canada Year Lists were David Bell with 351 species, Mark Dennis (330) & Paul Lagasi (329). In the province/territory categories there were 20 (+3) qualifying 2023 lists. Alberta, Ontario, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia each had 4 birders who exceeded the threshold for 2023, followed by Manitoba with 3.

Measures for best provincial list are not really comparable from province to province; some provinces have more species, some a higher percentage of rarities, some more difficult travel conditions, etc. So, it makes sense to examine more than one category. Three measures we usually mention here are **top percentage of the provincial list**; **top number of species**; and **beating the previous top list in a province/territory**.

In 2023, in the **beating the previous top list in a province/territory** category, there were no provinces with a new record this year. But Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop reported the closest, only 5 species short of a record; followed by Rob Parsons' 291 in Manitoba, 7 species short. In the **top number of species** category in 2023, James and Gerry Fox's 313's were tops, followed by Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop's 304 in NS. In the last category, the **top percentage** from any list across Canada came, as it often did in the past from Manitoba. Rob Parsons had 73 %, followed closely by James and Gerry Fox who had 72% of the AB list. With no clear winner this year, we will have to divide the Year Lister of 2023 award between all 4 of the above.

I would be somewhat remiss at this juncture if I failed to mention Bruce Di Labio's Canadian Year List of 479 for 2023. I believe this is a new record. Bruce is a former contributor and one can hope a future one as well. Bravo, Bruce!

***** WINTER SEASON LIFELISTS *****

Winter Season Lifelists, as opposed to the usual Winter Lifelists (December, January & February), are lifelists of species seen between the Winter Solstice and the Vernal Equinox: the actual season of winter. Thresholds in these categories are 10% less than the regular winter lifelists.

Your compiler decided to tackle counting his Winter Season lists a few years ago and found, though it presented some challenges, it was not so difficult as it at first appeared to be. I'm not sure how others have done it in the past, but here's what I did. The first task was to find a reliable place to get the exact date and time of the Winter Solstice and Vernal Equinox. That proved to be fairly easy in this day and age of the internet. There is a very useful page for Solstices & Equinoxes at https://www.timeanddate.com/astronomy/. Simply begin to type the location of your list in the box below "Equinox & Solstices" and click on the place from the list produced that will work for you. I used Halifax for my NS lists. If you have a time zone change within your area, you will need to adjust for it (plus or minus an hour). The site then comes up with Solstices & Equinoxes for Halifax (Surrounding 10 Years). Using the dropdown menu "Showing", on the right just above the table, you can get any years you will need. Of course, you will be able to use your month lists and take January and February complete, only needing to worry about December and March. I used those month lists to find any species not on the Jan.-Feb. combined list. Then I used eBird to bring up the species in question from my sightings to get their exact dates and times. Less checking than I thought, most were in or out by days. Those that fell on the very day of the Winter Solstice and Vernal Equinox required checking the time. One species was in by an hour and one out by an hour. Very few had to be checked this way. Of course, I know many of you don't use eBird or keep month lists, so this method will only work for those diehards that do. The rest will have to use longhand.

The winter season in Halifax for the next issue starts 11:27 AM, Dec. 21, 2023 and goes to 12:06 AM, Mar. 20, 2024. Remember, because we are creating a snapshot of lists at the end of a year, and single winter lists (as well as single winter season lists) don't fall within that timeframe, we are basically a year behind, using the last list to end before the year end. The following winter season list in Halifax starts at 5:20 AM on Dec. 21, 2024 and extends to 6:01 AM on March 20, 2025.

For all but a few northern areas and some special criteria lists, the thresholds for Local Lists are 150 for Lifelists and 120 for Year Lists. County combinations are higher at 180 and 150. Watch in the headers for thresholds in other lists. Local Lists are as reported up to the end of 2023. They are shown on a province-by-province basis, where possible. Local Lists are presented in five sections: Local Lifelists, Local Year Lists, Local Day Lists, Local Winter Lists and Local Single Winter Lists, similar to the way in which the major category lists are treated.

We gained five Local Lifelists areas from 2022's numbers, reaching 362. For Canadian locations, there are now 265 (+1) areas. ON leads with 73, then MB with 43, NS with 40, and BC with 37. There were 1494 (+72) individual entries: ON leading here too with 271, then BC with 147, NS 148, and MB 77. Included with the Local Lists are miscellaneous Canadian lists (including Canada-wide special criteria lists, AMAT (All Months Added Together) lists, and yard/patch lists (15); other Canada-related lists (9), and various foreign lists. The latter include the foreign national (66) and international geographical regions (22) lists that are favoured by many traveling listers. Comment and comparison are indulged in below under provincial headings. Comparing Local Areas becomes less and less possible as sizes vary more. Please send me the number of species listed on any local checklists you may have, that will surely help. Thanks.

Clarification of the Local Area Definitions is an ongoing process. The file is now on the internet site but is incomplete, out-of-date and needs your input. Especially helpful would be an email containing the text describing an area to be inserted. Thank you to those who have provided this.

To make reporting easier, I have asked listers to simply send an email (or note) with only the details of their lists that have changed. In most cases this amounts to less than ten updates. This will make my job easier too, something for which I fervently wish. However, you submit your numbers, please be careful and double check what you've written or typed. A goodly portion of time always seems to be taken to follow up on inconsistencies or ambiguities in reports. This year there was not much need to request clarification of reported numbers and when there was some ambiguity, I admit to making the occasional assumption rather than inquiries. Please correct me if I was wrong. And naturally, some problems may originate from this end.

<u>British Columbia</u>: The most active local list in BC in 2023 was the Vancouver Checklist Area with 11 updates and 1 new lister. Mike Toochin still has the highest local list total in BC, 389 in the Vancouver Checklist Area. Richard Cannings has the honours for the top interior list, 310 for the Okanagan Valley. For small sized areas, Mike Toochin's 279 for Iona Island is tops. Top gainers were Kevin Neill for Victoria and Eric Tull for Vancouver Island with +12 each. Thomas Plath joined the Vancouver Checklist Area with 361. No new areas were initiated in 2023.

Alberta: Reports hit a new low in Alberta with only 2 gainers and two new lists – Edmonton Region and St. Albert City Limits. Bill Wilson has the highest local list in the province, 345 in the Calgary Region (80 km). David Bell had the largest gain (+8) for the Medicine Hat eBird "county".

<u>Saskatchewan</u>: Activity stayed at one birder reporting gains on 4 lists. SK had no new listers in 2023. The largest gain was a plus 2 by Daniel Sawatzky in the SK Regional Parks list. Daniel Sawatzky has the highest local total in SK with 285 in Regina.

<u>Manitoba</u>: There were 27 individual gains in MB Local Lists in 2023. The top local gain of +8 was reported by Rob Parsons at Delta Beach. There was one new list – Pelican Lake. Winnipeg had the highest local list (Robert Parson's 313), although the Southeastern MB area might be considered by some as the highest "local" list for the province (Robert Parsons' 348).

Ontario: In 2023 the most active lists were the Point Pelee Christmas Bird Count Circle list with 7 updates and Essex (County) with 6 updates. Joshua Vandermeulen joined the Elgin (County) list with 233, to edge out Ken Burrell from top spot by three species. He also joined the Bruce County list (with 202), ON Prov. Parks (268), Haldimand (Single Tier Town) (234), and the Halton (Region) (252). Jim Watt had the top ON gain of 23 in Halton (Region). At 388, Keith Burk's Chatham-Kent/Essex/Lambton County combination is the top CLC Local List for ON but is a large multi-county area. Paul Pratt is 2nd here with 386. Paul Pratt's 368 in Essex County is the top "real" local list. Joshua Vandermeulen continues his assault on the All Ontario Counties Added Together category to reach 8824, adding 86 in 2023.

<u>Quebec</u>: The highest Local Lifelist is held by Peter Mitchell, with 342 in Montreal. Second spot goes to Mabel McIntosh at 341 in Montreal and third to Olivier Barden in Quebec City Region (COQ) (325). The sole gain in QC in 2023 was Eric Tull's +1 in the Montreal list.

<u>New Brunswick</u>: Again, most of the activity in NB came the Acadian Peninsula. The three gains came from 3 different areas, two in the Acadian Peninsula. The largest from Jolande St-Pierre, +3 at Grand Manan. There were no new lists or listers for New Brunswick in 2023. The top local lists are still all from the Acadian Peninsula, led by Rosita Lanteigne at 324. Benoit Lanteigne is next at 318. Jolande St-Pierre had the largest increase, a +3 on Grand Manan.

<u>Prince Edward Island</u>: The only gains were by David Seeler, who added 3 to Prince County & 2 to Queens County. The highest local lifelist for the province is his 286 in Queens County.

Nova Scotia: The most active areas in Nova Scotia were Shelburne County with 6 updates and Yarmouth County with 4 updates & 1 new lister. Top local listers were Clarence Stevens Sr. with 376 and Don MacNeill with 337, both in Halifax County; followed by Mark Dennis in Shelburne County with 328 and Alix d'Entremont in Yarmouth County with 325. Top small area list was Mark Dennis' 312 on Cape Sable Island. The top NS local area gainer was Dominic Cormier in Colchester County with +14. No new lists were started in NS in 2021. Dominic Cormier joined 8 lists in 2023.

<u>Elsewhere in Canada</u>: No changes in the remaining provinces and territories. In the Yukon, Wayne Neily had not only the top Local Lifelist, but the only one, 114 for Kluane National Park.

Foreign: In 2023, we had 3 new nations to bring us to 66 foreign country lists: new were Jamaica (Eric Tull & Brooke Clibbon with 119 & 102), Kazakhstan (David Milsom at 175) and New Caledonia (Eric Tull & Brooke Clibbon with 76 & 75). There were 112 (-11) updates and 51 (+8) new to lists reported on foreign lists, 52 (-15) and 40 (+3) for nation lists. Updates were down somewhat and new to lists were up a bit compared to last year. Four existing lists (plus the 3 new lists) have new leaders: Bob Curry (Kenya at 756), David Bell (Seenegal – 324), Paul Pratt (South Africa 567) and Paul MacKenzie (Africa – 1481).

MAJOR WORLD REGIONS (ABA defined continental and oceanic regions)

The American Birding Association (ABA) divides the entire world into nine Listing Regions, as shown on the ABA Listing Regions Map (http://listing.aba.org/descriptions/), and as supplemented by the specific descriptions below it. In the event of apparent conflict with the Map, the descriptions are controlling. Each of the five continental Listing Regions includes: (a) all interior seas; (b) "related" islands which lie generally within 200 nautical miles of the continent, as listed below in each continental description; and (c) a "pelagic belt," extending seaward 200 nautical miles from the coastline and/or from related islands, or half the distance to another continent (or to islands in an ocean Region) if closer. Ocean regions include ocean and islands more than 200 nautical miles from a continent. The South Polar Region, though involving a continent, is treated differently. It includes all land and ocean south of 52 degrees south latitude in the Atlantic and Indian Oceans, and south of 56 degrees south latitude in the Pacific Ocean. Where 56S in the Pacific reaches the 200-nautical-mile pelagic belt of South America, the boundary follows the edge of the pelagic belt around the tip of South America and northward in the Atlantic Ocean to 54S, thence eastward to 50 degrees west longitude, thence northward to 52 degrees south latitude, thence eastward to 147 degrees east longitude (the boundary of the Pacific Ocean Region), thence southward to 56S. This boundary approximates the Antarctic Convergence. The South Polar Region includes Shag Rocks, South Georgia, Bouvet (near 5E), and the Heard Island group. Excluded are the Falkland Islands, Kerquelen, and Macquarie Island.

There were 23 qualifying provincial lists. Ontario led the way in enthusiasm in 2023 with 6 qualifying lists. BC had 5. AB & NS were 3rd with 4 each, followed by NB with 2, & AB with 2 new lists. The highest 2023 local year lists were the 266 species from both Roger Foxall and Melissa Hafting for the Vancouver Checklist Area, BC, followed by 265 from Roger in the Metro Vancouver District. The Vancouver Checklist Area had the most qualifying lists with 4. A new CLC contributor high for existing Local Year List areas was registered by Rob Parson (276 for the Southeastern Manitoba). Bill Wilson initiated two new categories this year: Edmonton Region and St. Albert City Limits, Thresholds for Local Year Lists are 120 for most areas, 80 for some northern or hard to reach areas, and as marked for other areas, All Local Year Lists from 2023 are boldfaced.

Local Winter Season lists are 10% less than Local Winter Lifelists. High Local Winter Lifelist is still Danny Tyson's 260 in the Vancouver Checklist Area. In 2023, the top Local Winter Lifelist gain was by Larry Neily in the Annapolis Valley, NS with +8. The most active list was the Vancouver Checklist Area where there were 2 gainers and one new lister. No new categories were submitted in 2023. Top Local Winter Season Lifelists gains were by Larry Neily with +8 in the Annapolis Valley area. High Local Winter Season List was Clarence Stevens, Sr.'s 132 for Halifax County, followed by Larry Neily's 129 for Annapolis County. Local Winter listing seems to be disproportionately popular in Nova Scotia (31 of 50 categories). And Local Winter Season listing seems to be an almost wholly Nova Scotian phenomenon.

***** YEARLY STATISTICAL SUMMARY *****

There were 118 (up 1 from 2022, hereafter shown simply as +1) listers reporting 263 (-1) qualifying provincial or territorial lifelists. Five birders made the lists for 10 or more provinces or territories in 2023, but some are on the cutoff marks. Alex Gray and Peter Mitchell are on all 13 lists. The other 3 are missing NU and at least one other: Eric Tull (NS), Roger Foxall (NT & NB), Wayne Neily (NL & NB). It should surprise no one that same names, along with John Luce (8 lists) and Paul Pratt (7), hold the top seven spots on the ATPAT list.

A total of 120 (+1) birders made at least one of the 37 categories in the lifelist tables, while there were 785 total entries. Eleven listers were on 15 or more of the 37 categories. Eric Tull is on 28; Alex Gray on 26; Roger Foxall 21; David Bell & Wayne Neily 20 each; Brooke Clibbon, Peter Mitchell on 19 each; Larry Neily 17; Burke Korol and Dominic Cormier 16 each; & Paul Pratt with 15 lists each.

In the 2023 Year List section's 33 (E) categories, 90 (+3) birders were on at least one list, and the total number of listings was 402 (+24). Ten (+1) birders were listed 10 or more times, sometimes twice on a list if their 2023 total qualified and was less than their highest ever. Eric Tull was noted 24 times, followed by David Bell with 19, and Dominic Cormier with 18. In the Day List section there were 15 (E) categories, with 36 (+1) listers and 67 (+2) listings. Paul Pratt leads with listings in 10 categories. Alex Gray & Eric Tull had 6 each, and David Bell had 5.

In the new photography and audio recording lists, there are 10 (+3) lifelist and 3 (+1) year list categories. In the lifelist section there are 16 (+1) listers and 52 (+9) entries. In the year list section, there are 4 (+1) listers and 6 (+1) entries. David Bell is noted on 6 of the lifelist and 1 year list categories.

In the Winter Lifelist section there were 30 (E) categories, with 61 (E) birders and 169 (+1) listings. Leading all comers was Larry Neily with 15; followed by Clarence Stevens, Sr. with 10; then Bill Wilson with 8. There were 22 (+1) Single Winter categories, with 49 (E) listers and 116 (-1) listings. Leading in listings were Larry Neily with 8; and Alex Gray, Joan McDonald and Malcolm McDonald with 7 each.

We had 362 (+5) areas (including special categories) where Local Lifelists were kept, 129 (+1) for Local Year Lists, 15 (E) for Local Day Lists, 50 (E) for Local Winter Lifelists, and 30 (E) for Local Single Winter Lists. There were 107 (-2) listers, with 1494 (+72) individual listings in the Local Lifelists section, 68 (E) listers and 271 (+3) lists in the Local Year List category, 14 (+1) listers and 20 (+1) lists for Local Day Lists, 28 (+1) and 82 (+1) for Local Winter Lifelists, and 20 (E) and 52 (-1) for Local Single Winter Lists. Combining all 586 (+6) Local Listing categories there were 108 (-2) listers with 1918 (+75) entries. Larry Neily is on 102 individual lists, Clarence Stevens, Sr. on 89, Burke Korol 87, Eric Tull 83, and David Bell on 68. You will note that some numbers are down because several non-reporting birders have been removed from lists, see policy on page 37.

We now have 123 (-2) listers keeping lists for 736 (+11) categories. There were 3516 (+119) individual entries on our lists, for an average of 28.6 (+1.4) lists per birder. Thirteen (-1) listers are on fewer than five lists (7 current CLCers), while 15 (+2) had more than twice the average number of lists (58 or above) that passed their respective thresholds: Wayne Neily 59 (E), Alex Gray 61 (E), Don MacNeill 64 (E), Brooke Clibbon 67 (+7), Roger Foxall 67 (-1), Robert Parsons 72 (+4), Dominic Cormier 73 (new), Josh Vandermeulen 75 (new), Mike Toochin 75 (+1), Bill Wilson 75 (+1), Clarence Stevens, Sr. 113 (E), David Bell 130 (+3), Burke Korol 132 (+1), Eric Tull 152 (+5), and finally Larry Neily 162 (-2), who was the lister on the most categories.

The following are mostly brief excerpts (rarely with slight editing) from your messages, related to trips, birds or life's adventures; as well as some comments from the editor. Some of you have begun to send quotable material under the "News & Views" heading. That is very helpful and avoids my using material meant to be private. Alternately, you can designate certain words as private, as some do. To the many of you who said "Thank you", "You're welcome".

Alfred Adamo: 2023 was an extraordinarily good year for Ontario listing, even though I was away for almost the whole month of February in New Zealand. I added seven species to my Ontario list which I thought would not be possible from where my previous total was (425). In New Zealand, when I arrived in Auckland, it was still under a state of emergency based on the record rainfall the previous weekend. And my visit coincided with the passage of Cyclone Gabrielle which caused minimal disruption to our plans (not so for many unfortunate others) although it necessitated a lot more driving from the leader! In fact, the La Nina conditions, very active weather and record warm seas resulted in us encountering a much higher than expected number of vagrants. A visit to South America is slated for later this year, then a visit to see my daughter in Oxford next year where I hope to finally do some serious birding in Europe. Thank you again for your continued dedication in putting this together.

Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop: I was completely unaware of this publication until Mark Dennis mentioned it a couple of weeks ago, I suppose that is because I'm new on the NS birding scene, only having been birding for six years. Thus far, I have only birded Nova Scotia, with few road trips to New Brunswick and PEI, but my birding focus and 2023 Big Year has been for species in Nova Scotia. As you may know, I finished 2023 with 304 Nova Scotia species, 26 of which were NS Lifers. What a crazy year in birding 2023 was! I will attach a photo as documentation of one of the most exciting lifer experiences I had in 2023: Brown Booby at Chebucto Head, June 29. It was pouring rain and after going down the wrong path into the bushes then battling my way out again, only to find the correct path went down a very steep and rocky slope. Picking my way down the now flooded path, as the water came gushing down the cliff to the ocean, I managed to get to a spot where the Brown Booby could be seen without falling over the rocks, to observe and photograph it for a total of 28 seconds before it flew out of sight. It was worth it!

David Bell: Thank you for continuing to do this! 2023 was an interesting year for me, starting off in Senegal and with trips to Costa Rica in April and Nicaragua (family trip) in December, plus my usual field work in Alberta and British Columbia, before ending in Nova Scotia with more family time. Highlights of the year in Canada were Red-necked Stint and Gray Heron, and highlights abroad included Standard-winged Nightjar, Cricket Longtail, Silvery-throated Jay and Agami Heron.

Martin Bowman & Gillian Horgan: This was our first year since the pandemic began when we went birding beyond North America. Gillian and I had a great trip to Ecuador in January and I was in Scotland in June. Closer to home we did a 2,000 km road trip to northern Quebec in March. There were lots of special birds such as Oilbird, Hoatzin, Toucan Barbet, and Great Potoo in Ecuador, Eurasian Dotterel and Corn Crake in Scotland and Willow Ptarmigan in winter plumage near Chibougamau, Quebec.

George Bryant: We wintered in France and Costa del Sol, Spain in 2023 with Spanish Eagle and Moustached Warbler being two exciting highlights. Having reached the slow-go years, we took a one-month South Pacific cruise in November wherein I added eight to my all-time and most enjoyable list-world seabirds. At year end a trek to the Zapata Swamp, Cuba in a 1967 Simca produced a visible Spotted Rail after only one-hour of non-stop playback by the indefatigable guide—the dark side of birding!! I wish you many more years of bird listing, even if it is from an armchair.

Keith Burk: Last year was unreal for getting new birds, haven't had a year like that in a long time.

Dominic Cormier: My 2023 was spent entirely in Canada. I started the year off rather quietly, but did enjoy Nova Scotia's first Grey-crowned Rosy-Finch, and my Canada lifer Grey Heron wintering in Argyle. In February, I visited the Okanagan and the Kootenays. This was my first time back to BC since 2013, and my first winter visit. I was happy to add some winter birds to my BC life list, and add three Canada birds - Western Screech Owl, California Scrub-Jay, and Chukar, the latter two being lifers! I had missed the Chukar and owl during my 2013 BC sojourn, and the jay wasn't a regular bird for BC back then. I spent my spring in NS, with some bird-related work visits to NB. I later led a bird tour in NB in August, so I can finally submit a qualifying list for NB! Rarity-wise, I saw the Brambling in April up in Guysborough Co., which made 3 lifers for 2023. Jake Walker and I found a Mississippi Kite in June in Annapolis, which would have been mind blowing if not for the kite bonanza a lot of us were lucky to witness in 2022. I continued to add to my total NS county ticks, adding another 174, and slowly but surely getting to 3000. I am also past 150 for a number of counties, so I am

Dominic Cormier (cont'd): adding them to CLC this year. The fall was rather exciting, starting with Hurricane Lee in NS. While it mostly fizzled, I was fortunate to find 2 Sooty Terns with Alvan Buckley as we braved the winds and storm surge at Western Head, Queens Co! We later snagged a Least Tern. Both terns were Canada lifers. In October, I led another bird tour to SK for Whooping Cranes. There is nothing quite like the prairies in fall as the skies fill with waterbirds migrating south. All the while, NS delivered a bevy of top-notch rarities. In the end, I added 13 new NS birds, my second highest total in the past 8 years. For Canada, I got up to 10 adds by twitching the Limpkin and Vermillion Flycatcher in NS, and the Forktailed Flycatcher in NB. This was my second best total since 2013! For the coming year, I have a trip to Kenya in the works, and looking forward to the many birding surprises that always lay ahead.

Hugh Currie: The Clements World list was updated last October with numerous splits and very few lumps. This was another big year for Ontario with 3 new ones (same as last year). All 3 were new for Ontario and also Canada (where I am now over 500). Two of these were additions to my Simcoe County list. I grew up there. All this despite many years with zero or single additions of any kind. Birders are reluctant to admit it, but climate change has added a lot of excitement. Anyway, many thanks for all the hard work you are putting in.

Bob Curry: Once again, thanks for your tireless work on the 2022 report. To me it seems like painting the Firth of Forth Bridge; as soon as you finish a report you begin on the next year. Encouraged by a trip to NE Brazil I have this year, in addition to my usual lists, I've included some country life lists. Glenda and I also spent a couple of delightful February weeks on a Guatemalan coffee finca. The highlight for me was an epic hike up and down mountain slopes that yielded the iconic Horned Guan. Like Roger F. I have been having good fun slogging through my notes, which go back to 1954 (70 years by the end of this year!) to add them to eBird. It should be done chronologically but instead I dip in and out of years and pick lists that seem interesting. Hope I get them all entered! I'll send you three photos that may fill some space. Three additions for Canada and Ontario: White Wagtail, Limpkin and Roseate Spoonbill. As usual another mega turned up; in June we were in Utah looking at Cassin's Kingbirds when one turned up just outside Point Pelee. Canada and Ontario Winter in December: Black-and-White Warbler, Limpkin and Philadelphia Vireo. **Editor:** Sorry that I did not receive your photos and noticed too late to fix.

Rolph Davis: I had birding trips to Puerto Rico and Argentina. I spent many hours going through the annual update to the Clements/eBird World List. I added 12 new species in the 'Splits' section but then turned around and lost 6 species in the 'Lumps' section. We did a trip to Brazil to visit family but only got one new species. We did, however, have 8 species of macaw in a one hour period, which was kind of neat.

Mark Dennis: Many will remember 2023 in Nova Scotia as being a great year for birding. My highlight was the Grey-crowned Rosy-Finch in Green Bay, with a very strong supporting cast of new species for me in Nova Scotia: Common Ringed Plover, Brambling, Limpkin, Blackthroated Grey Warbler, Eared Grebe, Vermilion Flycatcher and Tundra Bean Goose. For a year with a not very birdy hurricane (Lee), it really was exceptional, and we were kept active right up until December 26th when a Say's Phoebe appeared not far away. At one point I thought I might make a 300 year but fell short, I should have tried harder, chasing more in spring, had I done 320 was possible, but I didn't. Locally, I started the year with a Common Gull on Cape Island and then added species throughout the year, they being Black Vulture, Redhead, Northern Rough-winged Swallow and finally, a King Eider. We lost Johnny Nickerson in the middle of the year, which was a blow for us birders. We all miss him and his birding tales, not to mention missing a good field birder around Cape Island. In May, we visited Alberta for the first time and had a great time, seeing three lifers plus a swathe of Canada birds. This pushed up the Canada list to almost respectable proportions and will shape future trips, especially if someone in BC ever starts running commercial pelagic trips (hint). Thanks for keeping Lister's Corner going, it's always a pleasure to read the next issue and see how people are doing. I wish everyone lots of birds in 2024.

Rob Dobos: I reached a couple of significant milestones in 2023. My 750th ABA area (including Hawaii) bird was American Flamingo, seeing the two birds in Franklin County, Pennsylvania on September 9, part of the wave of birds swept north by hurricane Idalia. Only five days later, I got my 500th Canadian species, the Roseate Spoonbill in Elgin County, Ontario.

Brian Elder: 2023 was a quiet year for me with no trips outside of the US and Canada. Despite the limited birding, it has taken me a while to put my update together as I'm transitioning from Avisys to ebird and Igoterra for my lists.

Gerry & James Fox: Once again our goal for 2023 was to reach 300 species in Alberta (eleventh consecutive year) but we wanted to concentrate our birding to the Edmonton area as much as possible. We did make one trip to each southern corner of the province and managed an overall total of 313 species. We were able to add two Alberta lifers (Brambling and Yellow-throated Warbler) in 2023. Birds of note for us in the Edmonton area were the Yellow-throated Warbler, Eastern Bluebird, Scarlet Tanager, Golden-crowned Sparrow, and one of our hi-lights of the year which was a Red-headed Woodpecker less than a kilometer from our home. We missed quite a number of Alberta regulars in 2023 including any jaegers, Anna's Hummingbird, Northern Mockingbird, Black-billed Cuckoo, Western Bluebird, and Buff-breasted Sandpiper. Our target birds for a number of years have been Smith's Longspur and Glossy Ibis which we once again did not see. We did not bird outside of Alberta in 2023. I don't remember if I ever mentioned that James is the eBird moderator for the northern half of Alberta. **Editor:** "Thanks again for your great photos Gerry."

Melissa Hafting: It was a great year for rarities in the province and I was able to get some new BC birds including a White-tailed Kite in Langley, Pinyon Jay in West Vancouver, Snowy Egret in Kamloops, a co-found Snowy Plover in Delta with Ilya Povalyaev and I got to see a long awaited for me White-eyed Vireo in Ucluelet and Scissor-tailed Flycatcher in Whistler and Green-tailed Towhee on Denman Island! Thanks Larry for all your work you do in compiling these lists. I have attached a few photos of the birds above all taken by me. **Editor:** Thanks for the great photos.

Anthony Kaduck: For me 2023 was year two of the Covid fight-back. I managed to get to Colombia again, after 2022's trip was cancelled, and spent a couple of weeks in the Cauca Valley and the Western and Central Andes. My brother and I booked a Galápagos cruise for July so needless to say we added a couple of days in the Mindo area and managed to get my target birds, especially the Plate-billed Mountain Toucan. Bolivia had been on my radar and in November I went with two friends for a good look along the Andes from Santa Cruz to Lake Titicaca and inland from there. The highlight of the year was a close encounter with a Rufous-bellied Seedsnipe at 15,800' - a new personal best for high-altitude birding!

Steve Knight: In Canada, I added a Summer Tanager, which was a Patagonia Picnic Table finding. People were visiting this spot to view a female Eastern Bluebird here in central Alberta that was paired up with a Mountain Bluebird. And then the improbable Summer Tanager showed up in the latter half of July, plumage was a mixture of yellow and red, very cool bird. In Alberta I added six to reach 344 species: Yellow-throated Warbler, Red-headed Woodpecker, Summer Tanager, Williamson's Sapsucker, Western Screech-Owl, & Glaucous-winged Gull.

Rudolf Koes: Many thanks for all your efforts putting this together. A huge task, but obviously a labour of love for you. Highlights of 2023 were trips to South Africa (with the family - not really a birding trip) and Madagascar (birds, mammals, reptiles, scenery and more). Most new species for the year were recorded during the Madagascar trip. Closer to home I conducted my usual birding course at the Churchill Northern Studies Centre in June – always a pleasure – plus various surveys and trips. Best bird of the year no doubt was a Vermilion Flycatcher, seen during a Nature Manitoba birding outing at Victoria Beach. This was a first for the prairie provinces.

John Luce: Appreciate the latest edition and all the hard work that goes with it. Birding has been quiet for years now due to a variety of circumstances, (I think it's called life!) but it's finally picked up. A hawk watching site has been found in Vancouver that's yielded success. El-Nino appears to have provided us with some exciting birds this fall and into early winter. Not sure what its continuing effects will have for rarities, but we remain optimistic. Climate change is another story. Pandemic – floods – forest fires, oh my! and what's next... I tried to do a Yukon, NWT trip but forest fires prevented that. Maybe it'll happen this year.

Paul Mackenzie: No international birding trips. No lifers this year. Some totals are lower which I cannot explain. A disappointing year as I was trying for 250 in the local area but got only 239. Many misses. **Editor:** I'm not sure if it is what is affecting your numbers, but eBird adjusts data for splits and lumps, among other things. This is a major reason for discrepancies. Lumps to Western Flycatcher, and more recently, Redpoll affect many of us.

Thor Manson: For 2023, it looks like my numbers are the same for all listing areas that I traditionally report to you. They lumped Pacific Slope, and Cordilleran Flycatcher, and I added Blue-black Grassquit for ABA Continental, so a net sum of zero!! **Editor:** Note that Thor has moved to Orcutt, California.

Joan & Malcolm McDonald: Another quiet year for us, another year with no trips. Nothing really to add to our lists, except for changes resulting from revisions to the taxonomy. Our birding was confined to Alberta.

Kevin Neill: And now for something completely different... Number of provinces that I have seen a Snowy Owl, while on a plane, on or around the airport tarmac - 6 provinces.

Mike Newey: My 7-year-old son, Luke Newey, has a Semiahmoo Peninsula list at 111.

Rob Parsons: And thanks, again, for all the work you put into this. I know I speak for many when I say how much I look forward to each CLC issue. Editor: Then I guess I will have provided you and some others with extra pleasant anticipation this year. Rob Parsons: A Vermilion Flycatcher at Victoria Beach in late October was certainly my most unexpected bird of 2023, and new for every list it qualified for, from Canada on down. It was a good year of Manitoba listing, and I wound up with 291 species, my second best ever, and my best without including a Churchill trip. I wasn't intending anything along the lines of a big year, but a friend and frequent birding companion, Jo Swartz, was quite keen to go after the rarities and often took me along, so I would say my accomplishment is from riding on her coattails. A few other highlights along the way included a Eurasian Tree Sparrow at a feeder in Sprague; a singing Wood Thrush on a territory east of Whitemouth Lake for the fourth year in a row; a Field Sparrow seemingly on territory west of Whitemouth Lake; a Rock Wren in a quarry in the Interlake; a Hooded Warbler in a north end Winnipeg backyard; a White-winged Dove at a

Rob Parsons (cont'd): feeder near Starbuck and a Pine Warbler at a Winnipeg feeder, which provided me with a first-ever warbler in winter in Manitoba. Canada, in spite of the Vermilion Flycatcher, remains at 419, because I neglected to account for 2022's crow lumping when I updated last year, but my Manitoba list climbs by one to 361 and Interprovincial Prairie Provinces region climbs to 372. My ATPAT list remains the same at 1237 (gain of flycatcher in MB and loss of crow in BC cancel one another out and no changes to other provinces) and my Total Ticks list is surprisingly higher at 4521. I say surprisingly because one or two of my US state lists have also decreased by one, thanks to the Western Flycatcher lump. My Manitoba year total of 291 is also the total for my Interprovincial Prairie Provinces & Canada year lists - this is the first time I have qualified for the Canada year list threshold in several years. ABA without Hawaii is 681. ABA area including Hawaii is 684. As in previous years, any other lists I fail to mention can be considered unchanged. My Canada Winter List climbs by one to 197, with the addition of White-winged Dove & Pine Warbler, partially offset by the crow loss in BC; and my Manitoba Winter List climbs to 141, an increase of four (other two species being Trumpeter Swan & Greater Scaup). My Prairie Provinces Winter life list climbs by four to 142, with the same species. Sadly, the crow lump reduces my best Canada Winter year list of 88/89 to 149, but I must have remembered, last year, to change the crow lump for my BC single winter list, as it remains unchanged on my computer, this year, at 127 for 88/89. My best Manitoba single winter list remains 15/16 (73) and my 22/23 MB winter of 55 is below the threshold. This brings me to your point about people not reporting annual lists. I took it to heart and carefully checked all my annual lists from this past year, but very few of them reached the thresholds. It's possible the time I spent seeking reported rare birds precluded enough repeat visits to smaller locations. I will mention the exceptions as I come to them. My Winnipeg eBird "county" list climbs to 292. My Delta Beach (Delta Marsh) list improves to 188 species. My Fort Whyte Centre list climbs to 201. My Kings Park list is now 177. My East Lake Winnipeg Beaches list climbs to 221, with the Vermilion Flycatcher. My Northwest Angle list climbs by two to 205, with Eurasian Tree Sparrow and Field Sparrow. My Patricia Beach list climbs to 174. My Pelican Lake list (new to CLC, but one I have kept for many years) reaches the threshold of 150. My Shoal Lakes Complex list climbs to 165. My SE Manitoba list climbs to 348 with the additions of Grasshopper Sparrow & Vermilion Flycatcher. My Whitewater Lake list climbs to 186. My Winnipeg list climbs by one to 313, with the addition of Grasshopper Sparrow. My AMAT MB list is now 2499 and AMAT Canada list is 2685, both gains of the same seven species, with Trumpeter Swan reaching every month in Manitoba status. My yard list climbs by one to 180. My Winnipeg winter life list climbs to 121, with the addition of Pine Warbler. My Lower 48 list climbs to 650, a seemingly inexplicable gain of 3, especially considering the flycatcher lump. Some newly countable exotics possibly took up the slack - not really the kind of armchair tick you would want! My USA list climbs by 3, for the same reason, to 654. I haven't birded the US for a few years, so any gain is from armchair ticks. Not many local annual lists to report—most of them are well below the thresholds. Southeastern Manitoba was a respectable 276, followed by Winnipeg at 175, and the eBird "county" of Winnipeg at 159.

Thomas Plath: I've been going through my field notebooks dating back to 1983 and entering them into ebird. There have been some adjustments to some lists. By the end of the year, I should be up to date, with my lists "cleaned up" and representing the latest in Clements taxonomic changes.

Ilya Povalyaev: My updated list totals are below. I'm also including a couple 'old' big day totals that I've never submitted. The BC big day was a record at the time (which stood for only a year) and the Vancouver big day is the highest in the CLC, but certainly not pushing the limits of what should be possible for the checklist area. I had a good year for BC birds in 2023, with White-tailed Kite, Scissor-tailed Flycatcher, Green-tailed Towhee, Great Black-backed Gull, and Pinyon Jay. Many of these represent past misses that were responsible for many sleepless nights; all water under the bridge now. Though not a new bird, another personal highlight of the year was finding a Red-necked Stint at Boundary Bay in Delta, BC. I have included its photo for this year's issue, along with a couple other photos. **Editor:** "Thanks for the great photos, Ilya."

Paul Pratt: After three years without much travel, it was good to be out exploring once more.

Daniel Sawatzky: My yard list went up by two in 2023 with one of those birds causing great excitement and resulting in about 60 people visiting from Nov. 6, 2023 to Jan. 10, 2024. The first confirmed SK record (3rd record) for Pygmy Nuthatch for some reason picked my yard to hang out in for a couple of months. It was a very cooperative bird and the vast majority of those who showed up got great looks. Unfortunately, the first cold snap of the winter ended the visits with the bird most likely succumbing to the cold. A trip to the UK in April of 2023, including the Norfolk coast, Edinburgh, Inverness and the Cairngorms finally put me over the 1000 mark.

Andrew Slater: In 2023 we stayed near home, except that in early September we were invited by a friend of my wife to stay with her for a few days in Victoria, B.C. This was the first time that I had been out of Alberta since 2019. I took the occasion to become reacquainted with some West Coast birds, but the highlight of our stay was definitely the sight of a pod of Orcas from our hostess' picture window overlooking Gonzalez Bay! In Calgary the highlight of the year was the protracted visit of a Winter Wren to a park near home, which for me was a new bird for the Prairie Provinces.

Eric Tull & Brooke Clibbon: First I want to thank you as always for the amount of work you have put into producing Canadian Listers' Corner. It is very much appreciated. 2023 was a great year for Brooke and me. We made up for time lost due to the pandemic with trips (1) to Senegal, to complete the trip we had to cancel half-way through due to covid, (2) to Bhutan with birding in Thailand en route there and back, and (3) to New Caledonia, with birding in New Zealand on the way back. On two consecutive days in Senegal, I accomplished three goals. On the first day, we saw a Violet Turaco, which was bird number 1000 for Africa, my fourth continent with 1000 species. The next day on a small boat ride along the Gambia River, we had close-uo looks at several Egyptian Plovers, a spectacular bird with electric blue legs. It is the only species in a monotypic family, and my second-to-last non-passerine family. Later the same boat ride we saw an African Finfoot, which was my bird number 5000, worldwide. So three goals in two days with three great birds - no heard-only's, no lbj's, and no taxonomic

Having completed all these goals I am not sure what comes next. There is no way I could ever see all the passerine families. As we were walking into our hotel in Noumea, the capital of New Caledonia, someone behind me said "Eric?" I turned and saw it was Peter Candido, a birder from Vancouver. It was a big surprise to bump into someone I knew with us both staying in the same hotel on an isolated island on the other side of world. He was also chasing the Kagu. I put together a bit of doggerel that you might - or might not - want to use when you send the next note out to subscribers.

So you had a good year - did you really? Birded from Yukon to Pelee? Then add up your lists Make sure nothing's missed And send your results to L. Neily.

Dan Tyson: The CLC keeps on growing with an ever astounding and complex list of lists. It is always an epic read, with some great stories and amazing photographs. Your compiling skills are truly astounding. Numbers are listed below, if they are too late, not a problem.

Josh Vandermeulen: One note from the report: Hamilton (municipality) is listed twice. First, on page 57 as Hamilton, City of (Single Tier City). It is also listed on page 59 as Hamilton (City). These are both referring to the same thing: the county/municipality. This is different than the Hamilton Study Area, which is a much larger area that is a circle with a 25 mile radius, and which is treated separately on page 59. Also, can you change my location from Niagara Falls, Ontario to Hamilton, Ontario. Editor: "Thanks, Josh. I have made the necessary changes." Josh Vandermeulen: After a couple of years of intense travel, Laura and I returned from the tropical regions of the world to "settle down" in Hamilton, Ontario partway through 2023. That being said we still were fortunate to travel to a variety of locations in the year. We began with two months in Argentina, followed by a brief visit to Uruguay and two months in Brazil (focusing mainly on the Atlantic forest). I led a couple of tours this autumn, including one to Sulawesi and Halmahera in Indonesia in September, and one to Galápagos in November. I also spent a week after the Galápagos tour exploring some areas on my own in Ecuador, cleaning up on the few new species remaining for me in these areas. The rest of the year was spent in Ontario where I focused on county ticks. Despite being absent for about half the year, I still picked up six new Ontario birds as well. A big highlight was seeing the province's first Western Flycatcher.



"Johnny" joined us in 1996 on Burke Korol's watch. He was the ultimate patch birder. His beat was Cape Sable Island (CSI), NS, where he had the top list since 2000, as well as for Shelburne County where it is situated. His 334 for CSI and 346 for Shelburne County, good totals for the entire province, have yet to be superseded.

MULLIGAN, ARTHUR WILLIAM (MIKE) (November 6, 1931 - October 13, 2023)

Mulligan, Arthur William (Mike), 91, of Calgary, Alberta, was born in Council Bluffs, Iowa, and died peacefully with family by his side on October 13, 2023, after having led a full and wondrous life. Many of Mike's formative years were spent in Brainard, Minnesota. It was there, while working at Madden's Resort on Gull Lake, that he met his beautiful and loving future wife, JoAnn Godfrey. The two were married in 1956 and promptly set about building what would soon become their family of seven. Mike and Jo created a loving home for their young family in Minnetonka, MN, where Mike worked initially as a salesman for Culligan Soft Water, ultimately rising to and retiring as Vice President of Operations. In 1965, when Mike was asked to relocate to Canada to help open the first Canadian Culligan branch, he and Jo took the leap, packed



up their five children, ages 2 to 8, and hopped on a train to head out for a new life in Calgary.

For the rest of his life's journey (in what might be described as a "circuitous route"), Mike and Jo resided at various times in both Calgary and Minneapolis, eventually landing back in the Calgary neighborhood of Inglewood, a community they loved and contributed to in numerous ways for many wonderful years. Mike's love for his family came first but his passion for birdwatching was a close (some might say, VERY close) second. He was a highly renowned birder who organized and led bird-watching trips all over the world. Some of his most memorable trips took him to Costa Rica, Panama, Mexico, Alaska, and Kenya. It wasn't only the birds, but also the local guides and the many fascinating people he met along the way that drew him back time and time again.

Mike served his communities in many ways, including a deep commitment to the Rotary Clubs in both Calgary and Minneapolis and active memberships/volunteer work at the Minnesota Ornithologists' Union and the Inglewood Bird Sanctuary, as well as many other organizations. Mike is survived by his wife JoAnn; his children Mary, Kathy (Bruce) Granquist, Zita (John), Jean, and John (Nataliya); his grandchildren Connar, Emma (Matt), Alex, Liam, Aaron, and Brooks (Tarri); great-grandchildren Domenic and Amelia Jo; beloved sister Patricia (Georgia), and many other dear relatives and friends, near and far. Mike was preceded in death by his parents Dr. Arthur and Mildred Mulligan; brother Pat; sister Zita, and grandson Gabriel. (quoted from obit)

"Mike made a lasting and important contribution to birding in Alberta, being a founder of Albertabird back in 2000, a volunteer at Inglewood Bird Sanctuary, and a bander with the Calgary Banding Society. He was a member of Nature Calgary and contributor to the Bird Study Group. Mike participated enthusiastically in many bird counts and similar activities in the Calgary region and beyond. Mike was a very well-travelled international birder, and he made, and organised, many trips throughout the Americas as well as Africa and Australia. Mike had a special interest in the birds of Alaska, Costa Rica and of course Canada. Three of us were privileged to be with Mike in our 2012 Canadian Big Year, Fur and Feathers 500. His knowledge, kind nature, energy and stamina made Mike a wonderful birding companion and mentor." — Phil Cram

Mike Mulligan joined the CLC in 2010. He had top lists in Central America, Mexico, Panama, Costa Rica, & North America. He had a huge ABA list of 791 and ABA Continental of 778. His Lower 48 list of 721 was good for 2nd spot. His Alberta list was 364, behind only the McDonald's. As Phil Cram stated above, the 2012 Canadian Big Year team was one of Mike's birding highlights. He and Phil, along with Brian Elder and Ray Woods saw over 430 species, a new high at that time.

In Memoriam

NEILY, WAYNE PATRICK (March 17, 1946 - March 17, 2024)

Wayne passed away at the family home in Tremont, Kings Co., NS on Sunday, March 17, 2024, on his 78th birthday. He was a son of the late Earle B. and Vivian E. (Barkhouse) Neily. Surviving are a daughter, Viv Ross, Michigan; and brother, Larry (Antoinette) Neily, Lawrencetown, NS. Wayne graduated from West Kings District HS and Acadia University (B. Sc. - Biol.), where Robie Tufts was a mentor and friend. He worked for Parks Canada as a Park Naturalist and planner in Cape Breton Highlands, Kluane, Nahanni, and Wood Buffalo National Parks. In the late 1960's, while at CBHNP, he established the first nature interpretation program for CBHNP. He was a member of the Cape Breton Branch of the NSBS and led several NSBS field trips.



His next stop was as the first Park Naturalist at the newly minted Kluane NP in the Yukon. Here he carried out an initial bio-survey, being flown to remote spots in the park by helicopter and trekking to the next pickup spot days later. He also set up the first nature interpretation program for the park.

Wayne lived in Manitoba for many years and started interpretive activities at Oak Hammock Marsh and the Fort Whyte Nature Centre. One of Wayne's main goals in life was to impart his knowledge of the beauty and fragility of nature to others. He wanted to help people consider the impact of all their decisions on the environment. To this end, he got a B. Ed. from the University of Winnipeg and worked as a teacher in Manitoba & Nova Scotia. He also ran his own business, Peregrine Heritage Services, which did environmental assessments, genealogical research, birding tours (notably to Churchill), etc. Wayne was involved in many environmental groups, often in leadership roles (director, chairman or executive), including the NSBS, ABA, CNF, YukonCS, Manitoba Env. Council, etc.

Over the years, he contributed to many volunteer birding initiatives, including 60 years' worth of Christmas Bird Counts, in most of which he was compiler in at least one. Despite living "out west" for over 30 years, he compiled the Kingston, NS count 19 times. He compiled the Winnipeg CBC for many years and while he couldn't do much to increase the species count, he ramped up participation to vie for the highest in North America. He took part in BBS's for nearly 50 years, did Owling Surveys and was an keen eBirder.



He avidly followed Gerry Bennett's "Statisticae Canaadensiis" from its beginnings and contributed his numbers from 1987. Many of you knew him and a good number would have birded with him. He traveled widely in Canada and consequently was second only to Eric Tull for many years in the ATPAT category, still holding down 5th spot presently. He qualified for 20 of our lifelist categories, behind only 4 others. He can be found on an astounding 59 lists, without any winter list totals. He had qualifying lists in 10 of 18 Nova Scotian counties. Because Manitoba had no counties, he began reporting latilong lists there. This elegant

solution to create reasonably sizzed fixed divisions never caught on, perhaps because of the lack of GPS and map reading skills in those days. His listing interests extended to the ABA, of which he was a director in its early days. He was well-respected in birding and environmental circles and will be greatly missed.
